1. tótseha hákó'e tséška'èškónéhévétse ná'éveévo'sóéme tóxeo'hé'e
Long ago, far past, when we were children we were playing by river.
2. ná'öhkeéetoo'hamēme
We would swim.
3. néhe'še hó'ótóva náhne'évaasēme
Then suddenly we left.
4. náhtae'ohtsēme hoéhose
We went up hill.
5. néhéóhe ná'éveévo'sóéme
There we played.
6. tséohné'ameohtsése hetane
He was approaching, a man.
7. hátaháóhe néstséhe'öhtse
"Over there, come!"
8. néxhémeva ho'enóhkono
Come eat tubers!
9. náma'xemé'oma'ásso'o éxhevoo'o
I plowed up a lot," he said.
10. naa náxhestomeévo'sóéme
But we were too busy playing.
11. násáa'éeáahtovohéne
We didn't listen to him.
12. néhe'še hó'ótóva na'ëstse tséohtséheese he nétahémévoneo'o
Then suddenly one (of us) said "Hey! Let's go to eat
ho'enóhkónésono tséoxheese
the little tubers!" he said.
13. naa nóheta náxhéme
And "Let's go!" we said.

14. tséohtaovóeaset'a'xèse ma'eve'èse
He took off first, Redbird.
15. néhe tséohnéhxéheváenòse he'áhtsenéva ma'evotóneva
This one grabbed her by the hand, Redplume.
16. tséohtaaséta'xevòse
They ran off.
17. háp'o'e násemahe he'ama-náhkohe he'ahtse náhtaheseváenomōvo
Likewise my younger brother. Up-bear, his hand I grabbed his (hand).
18. náhtaaseta'xême
We took off.
19. náhtaaméhó'e'ovóneo'o nenóve'še
We followed them a little ways behind.
20. tséstanéšenáamo'ahéotsétse tséohtahétöhtáno hova'ehe
While we were runnng he ran over something.
21. tséoxxaehoó'heaxàxévaotse
(We) overheard it rattle.
22. tséohtséneohevòse ma'evoto naa ma'eve'èse
They stopped running, Redplume and Redbird.
23. tséohtanéhotsetóo'óvòse ho'ëva
They looked down to the ground.
24. náhtamóného'o'ahéotsême
We soon arrived.
25. hótåhtse ma'xèšé'šenovötse tséoxxamaetšéšeé'eka'a'eoo'èse
Behold, (it was) a big snake. It was holding up its head.
26. votse náxhohátsême
Unknowingly, we laughed.
27. násáhéné'enovöhéneo'o tséohkéhešená'senëvòse
We did not know that they bite.

28. náhtähóseasēme
We went on again.
29. hánaháóhe hetane tséstsetóma'xovàse náhtáho'éhnēme
There the man where he was plowing we arrived.
30. ná'éemévoneo'o ho'enóhkonèsono
We ate the little tubers.
31. náhoháeónéšeōhtse tséoxheese ma'eve'ése
"I'm in great pain," said Redbird.
32. nétaévaé'éhnema hoéhose tséoxheese
"Let's go back up the hill!" he said.
33. náhne'évaé'éhnéme
We went back up.
34. néhéóhe náxhóséhoháé'éšeévo'sóéme
There we again played a lot.
35. nèhe'sé móxhoháamátòháhe hestse'ko
Then it must have really hurt him, his leg.
36. éhoáeónéšeōhtse náhtse'ko tséoxheese
"It hurts really bad, my leg," he said.
37. náhtaanòheohtsēme tséhvéestove
We went down to the camp.
38. tóxeha o'hé'e éhvéeo'o
Along river they were camping.
39. náháóhe tséstáho'éhnétse náxo'tsenéhetóneo'o néhe tsévéese
There when we arrived we tried (failed) to tell those who were camped.
40. éahanomāā'e šé'senovoto náxho'tsenéhetóneo'o
"It bit him, a snake," we tried to tell them.
41. nássáa'amáhtóehéneo'o
They did not listen to us.
42. náhnetséstöeneo'o ta'e tséhxéne'enomévöse tséhešeóha'otse hestse'ko
They doubted us until they found out that it was swollen, his leg.

43. náhmónenótseamáhtóeneo'o
They finally believed (listened to) us.
44. éxhoháetanóotseo'o
They got really scared.
45. tósa'e étaeeahanomā'a'e náxhetā'a'e
"Where did it bite him?" they said to me.
46. náhtaévatse'óhtséhoo'o néhéóhe šé'šenovótse tséahanó'sénése
I took them back there (to) snake where it bit.
47. tséoxhovánee'ese néhe šé'šenovótse
It was gone, that snake.
48. mó'éšeasevonéhnéhēhe
It must have already crawled away.
49. kásováahaho tséhnéhmaeho'éhnévöse
Young men arrived from all around.
50. éhnöhtse'ovovo néhe šé'šenovoto
They looked for that snake.
51. néhe'se tséoxhósého'táhoevöse tóhé'késáévé'hó'e
Then they arrived, cowboys.
52. éhmóhonanovo
They looked for it everywhere.
53. tósa'e éssáamé'ovóhevo
They didn't find it anywhere.
54. votá'máhove'se néhe tóhé'késáévé'hó'e éstamé'ovovo néhe šéšenovoto
Finally those cowboys found that snake.
55. hótáhtse éxhoháa'estóneehe ma'xéšé'šenovótse
Behold, it was really long, a big snake.
56. é'ahanóhnovo néhe šé'šenovoto
They killed that snake.
57. néhe'se náhne'évaase

Then I came back.

58. náhtaéváho'éhótoo'o
I went back to them.
59. éssáa'évaévo'sóetanōhe tse'tohe ka'ěškóne ma'eve'ěse
He did not want to play, this child, Redbird.
60. móxhoháeóněšeohstséhēhe
He must have been in great pain.
61. heséeo'ótse éxho'tsetséhetanomovónovo
Medicine they tried to apply.
62. éssáaho'to'eotséhe
It did not help.
63. héne taa'ēva tséhvóoneohtsetse éxhovánee'e
That night when it was dawning he died.
64. naa néhe'še ná'óhkéhoháe'o'háevamaeneo'o néhe'xovéva
And then they would really warn us at that time.
65. tósa'e ná'óhkésáa'évanóhpáho'óhtséhéme
Nowhere could we go.
66. hena'háanéhe tséhetaa'óhta'hanéto
That's all that I have to tell.
